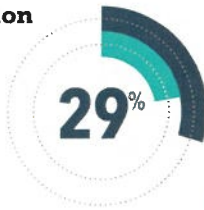


ECU Diversity *by the* Numbers

The representation of racial/ethnic minorities' in the student population at ECU has grown from 22% (5,883) in fall 2012 to 29% (8,431) in fall 2018.

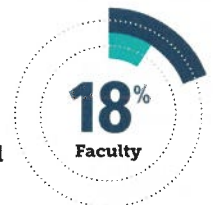
► The Hispanic student population has more than tripled since 2009.

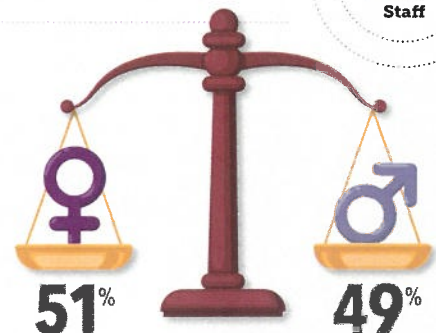
